Report on "D" & Bow shackles for attaching safety chains to towing vehicles

There have been a few reports recently about people being fined for having the incorrect type of "D" shackle to attach whatever they were towing to their vehicle – be it a caravan, boat or trailer. So far I have not been able to actually find anyone who has been fined for this unless they were towing something without the chains being actually connected.

I have checked quite a few websites of various state government departments and they all recommend that the shackles used should meet Australian Standard AS2741-2002 "shackles" or another equivalent standard, and that they have a break-load limit that is 1.5 times greater than the ATM of the trailer.

Recent stats from the Bureau of Statistics indicates that the largest growing sector of Internet Users is the seniors of our Community, outstripping all other age groups. When I talk to a variety of Caravan Club members - most have laptops (if not mobile devices) when they travel (even when they don't) and they are nearly always emailing and searching the NET.

It is a great way to publicise your group to the entire community. All of the statistics so far indicate that most new enquiries are made through the initial website contact than any other method.

Through my personal connection with ACCVIC, clubs have 3 basic alternatives:

- 1. Find someone to organize a website for you.
- 2. ACCVIC is offering clubs the opportunity to have their own dedicated page as part of the ACCVIC website, at no cost, FREE. You will be able to add, edit, delete and place photos along with any information you feel is relevant to your clubs activities. Remember, this only gives you one page not an entire website. For some clubs that will probably be sufficient. To see an example from a couple of clubs that have already taken this opportunity, go to www.accvic.org.au, select the 'Affilates' item in the menu and you will see a couple of clubs listed have a look at their respective pages could this help you?
- 3. You have your own entire website (any number of pages you wish) and therefore have you own web address e.g. www.ballaratcaravanclub.org.au and also have all the email provisions you require this option does have a cost of \$88.00 per year. No contract of hidden extras and you can cancel at any time.

With options 2 & 3, I supply adequate support to help get you started – no cost.



Caravaners getting a Bad Rap!

Our three months trip to Cape York staying at both free camps and Caravan parks.

Jeanette and I heard from a lot of Councils and owners of caravan parks that they are closing free camps and raising prices of parks because of the rubbish and mess that caravaners leave behind. I found it to be the opposite on most occasions. We found that caravaners took their rubbish with them.

What we did see was back packers abusing free camps and stealing from Caravan Parks. On a number of occasions we saw back packers wait until the Park office was closed then jump fences and use camp kitchen and toilets of the parks. The rubbish they left was unbelievable; we actually cleaned up three camp kitchens' that had been left a mess after backpackers had used them.

We spoke to the owners of the park about the mess and one reply was "Well what do you expect us to do about it we can't monitor it 24 hours a day". These parasites cause caravaners to get a bad and undeserved reputation.

We spoke to a couple of backpackers and when they rented their vehicle they were giving a book on tips on how to "beat the system" ie wait until office was closed until you used the facilities (camp

Kitchens), Wait until no one is around and check out the camp kitchen fridge for food stuffs, stand next to a locked toilet door and wait for one of the residents to enter then follow behind, if there was no gate at the park entrance again wait until the office is closed then drive in and park right at the back of the park and leave early in the morning so you don't have to pay and probably the worst bit of advice they were given "Don't worry about any fines you are given by the time they get to court and they find you, you will be back in your own country. Councils can't enforce the fines and they can't physically force you to move form a spot until they take you to court (usually 21 days) this was definitely the evident in Cairns.

Maybe some caravan park owners and councils need to be enlightened into what actually happens after 5pm closing.
